 OR
- May be submitted for the 2023/24 Nedbank-Treasury-WCED Essay Writing Bursary Competition (2 200 words) by promising learners (maximum two per school). The latter essay, however, <u>may only be submitted in English</u>.

<u>Scenario and background:</u>

President Cyril Ramaphosa's State of the Nation address called on South Africans "to forge a new consensus" and to work together to "revitalise the economy". He spoke of the deep structural problems and the need "to enable businesses to grow and create jobs alongside expanded public employment and social protection".

This echoes the commitments made in the 2011 Green Economy Accord, which include promoting economic development, creating job opportunities – especially for young people – and forming a "social compact on the transition".

- **Evaluate** the **impact** of a green economy **on renewable and non-renewable resources** within the South African economy.
- **Evaluate** the current **green economy initiatives** as set out in the Green Economy Accord signed by the South African government and the private sector and the impact thereof on economic growth and development.
- **Suggest recommendations** to the South African government and the private sector on how to respond to the current high unemployment rate, especially among the youth of our country, as well as low economic growth, through the creation of a green economy to ensure improved economic growth and economic development.
