# A round-up of 2016/17

- A number of appointments were made in key strategic positions such as the appointment of a new Superintendent General, Brian Schreuder, with effect from 1 December 2016.
- Three Western Cape teachers won awards in the National Teaching Awards of 2016.
- The Cape Teaching and Leadership Institute (CTLI) provided:
  - 14 two-week long training courses
  - two two-day conferences in Languages and Mathematics to 1 896 Grade R, Foundation and Intermediate Phase teachers
  - 23 ICT integration interventions, reaching 1 214 teachers and School Management Teams



- The pass rates of schools serving the poorest communities (Quintiles 1–3) have shown an increase, while the number of underperforming schools has decreased.
- > The Safe Schools Programme has a three pronged approach:
  - (i) Crime control with the provision of core security mechanisms,
  - (ii) Programmes to support behavioural and attitudinal change, and
  - (iii) Whole school approaches and networking with relevant agencies that assist with the creation of safe school environments.
- 180 Mass participation, Opportunity and access and Development (MOD centres) operate at schools across the eight education districts.
  - 97 of these centres operate at primary schools.
- > A total of 176 new principals were appointed during 2016.
- The end of 2016 heralded a re-energising of the WCED with emphasis being placed on our values and the Mantra, "Enter to Learn and Leave to Serve".



The graph below summarises recent progress in pass rates. The increases in Grades 9–11 are noteworthy, especially in Grade 9.



### **National Senior Certificate**

The WCED achieved:

- > 86% in the National Senior Certificate examinations an increase of 1,3% from 2015.
- > 40,9% of candidates achieved bachelor passes, the highest percentage in South Africa.
- > A record breaking pass rate of 77,2% in Mathematics and
- > 73,8% in Physical Science.
- > The best performing district (Overberg) in the country with a pass rate of 92,61%, up from 89,65%.
- > The top three learners in the country

# Redress

The funds provided for schools to cover educational running expenses are weighted so that schools in poorer communities are allocated more funds. Schools are divided into quintiles based on the poverty levels of the surrounding community. Schools in national quintiles 1–3 received pro-poor weightings. The "per learner" amounts paid to public schools in National Quintiles 1, 2 and 3 were equalised from 2013/14, ensuring that, NQ 2 and 3 schools receive the same funding as NQ 1 schools.

# Our budget

The WCED spent 98,8% of the approved adjusted budget for 2016/17.

- 73,3% of the budget was assigned to the compensation of employees (CoE).
- Savings were recorded in the CoE budget, mainly due to the lower than anticipated temporary appointments.
- Further savings were directed to the improvement of school infrastructure and assistance provided to schools facing financial challenges.
