

Metro South celebrates T2P in style

Metro South Education District (MSED) hosted an intimate Transform to Perform (T2P) lunchtime award ceremony, honouring selected schools in their district that have thoroughly embraced T2P's Change and Growth Mindset pillars for 2021.

The event, held at Westcott Primary School in Diep River, was well attended. The festivities were kickstarted by Acting District Director, Isobel Senosi, who welcomed all in attendance and commended her district's T2P team for actively and enthusiastically driving the strategy across the district – so much so that T2P regularly features on the District Management Team's agendas.

Thereafter, Warda Conrad, the provincial strategy driver of T2P, delivered the keynote address. Warda Martin-Conrad, who heads the MSED team, sealed the overwhelming success of the event with a vote of thanks. She explained that they wanted to underscore the impact of T2P programmes on the entire education system through events such as these.
